

# MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 3rd APRIL MONDAY 2023 AT 7.00PM IN SPEEN VILLAGE HALL

#### **PRESENT**

#### 1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

#### 3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

It was noted that the repairs to the bollard at Speen Stores is still outstanding.

## 5. ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COUNCIL

The Chair reported as follows:

#### Overview

Focus continues on a range of traffic calming initiatives, continued upgrade and maintenance of Council assets and Parish infrastructure, as well as the review of planning applications.

The Chair extended her thanks to all Cllrs for their continued endeavours, as well as Unitary Cllrs and staff at Transport for Bucks and the Unitary Council for their ongoing support.

#### **Financial**

Expenditure was in excess to budget due to extra Jubilee costs of £22k.

Budget for 22/23 was £36k with expenditure YTD Dec 22: £49k.

Other variances Year on Year attributable to timings and completion of various traffic calming projects.

Ample reserves available to accommodate contingencies. Cash balance last year was £75k whilst cash balance year to date Feb 23 is £58k.

Cllr Davies noted that no increase in Precept has been requested from Parishioners since 18/19.

#### **Traffic Calming**

MVAS operational effectiveness has been impacted by vandalism, which has taken at least a year to resolve.

One of the 3 x MVAS has now been commissioned back into action with improvements in the security of the unit, to determine its effectiveness against further vandalism.

Across the Parish the implementation of a Community Speedwatch Project has commenced to help as a further deterrent to speeding. The Chair extended her thanks to those volunteers supporting this initiative.

A number of trevello strips were also commissioned to determine speed data along New Road. This data is currently being reviewed.

#### Maintenance

Agreement was reached with local volunteers for an extended revamp of Studridge Lane Pond, Speen over a 4-year cycle.

Bus shelters were also regularly upgraded, with the shelter opposite the RAF station fully repaired following damage due to severe weather.

A replacement notice board for Speen has also been installed.

## **Playground**

Continued regular inspections, monthly, quarterly and annually take place to ensure the highest standards of safety are implemented.

No major equipment was purchased this year, but a picnic table replacement was provided.

#### **Garden of Rest**

A major overhaul of the Garden of Rest took place this year to coincide with her late Majesty's Jubilee including the installation of new decorative metal gates and the resurfacing of the driveway.

#### Grants

In addition to the regular annual schedule of some 8 discretionary grants to local churches, village halls, amenities and local charities, the Council had been pleased to approve an additional 7 grants this year toward a further number of initiatives across the Parish.

#### **Planning**

The Chair emphasised the Council remains committed to protecting the integrity of the three villages in line with the Village Plan and within the context of Parishioners residing with an ANOB.

Some 49 applications have scrutinised and reviewed year to date and commented upon where appropriate.

## **Outlook:**

The Chair concluded her report by stating that the Council remains committed to tackling key issues of concern – eg traffic calming/infrastructure and takes every effort to upgrade the fabric of the Parish for the benefit of all Parishioners and continue to support local initiatives and community groups where it can, across the three villages.

Parishioners are particularly encouraged to apply for more grants toward projects to benefit the local community in 23/24.

#### 6. REPORT FROM UNITARY COULCILLORS

Cllr Etholen noted that issues with waste collection have not as yet been resolved.

The discussion with Oxfordshire Cllrs is ongoing with regard to Bledlow Recycle site visits.

Cllr Etholen highlighted the additional Buckinghamshire Council funding that would be available for pot hole repairs.

The traffic issues regarding the junction between Loosley Hill and Lower Road would be tabled at the Community Board Traffic Sub Group to determine the options to resolve the issue.

#### 7. MVAS REPAIRS

One unit is being piloted with new security measures. Decision will be made to commission the other two units before the next meeting.

## PLAYGROUND RISK ASSESSMENTS AND REPAIRS

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It was agreed that the tennis club sign should be removed or cleaned.
