Cllr Etholen indicated that the Board would investigate the proposal to implement a 40-mph limit between the RAF base and the 30mph sign. Informal and formal consultation would then follow.

It was noted that the provision of traffic islands and pedestrian crossings were not feasible due to cost.

The proposal for traffic parking enforcement officers in the vicinity of St John's school was approved. CE/AD

The extension of the school bus services from Speen to extend to Princes Risborough and Walters Ash was also being considered.
